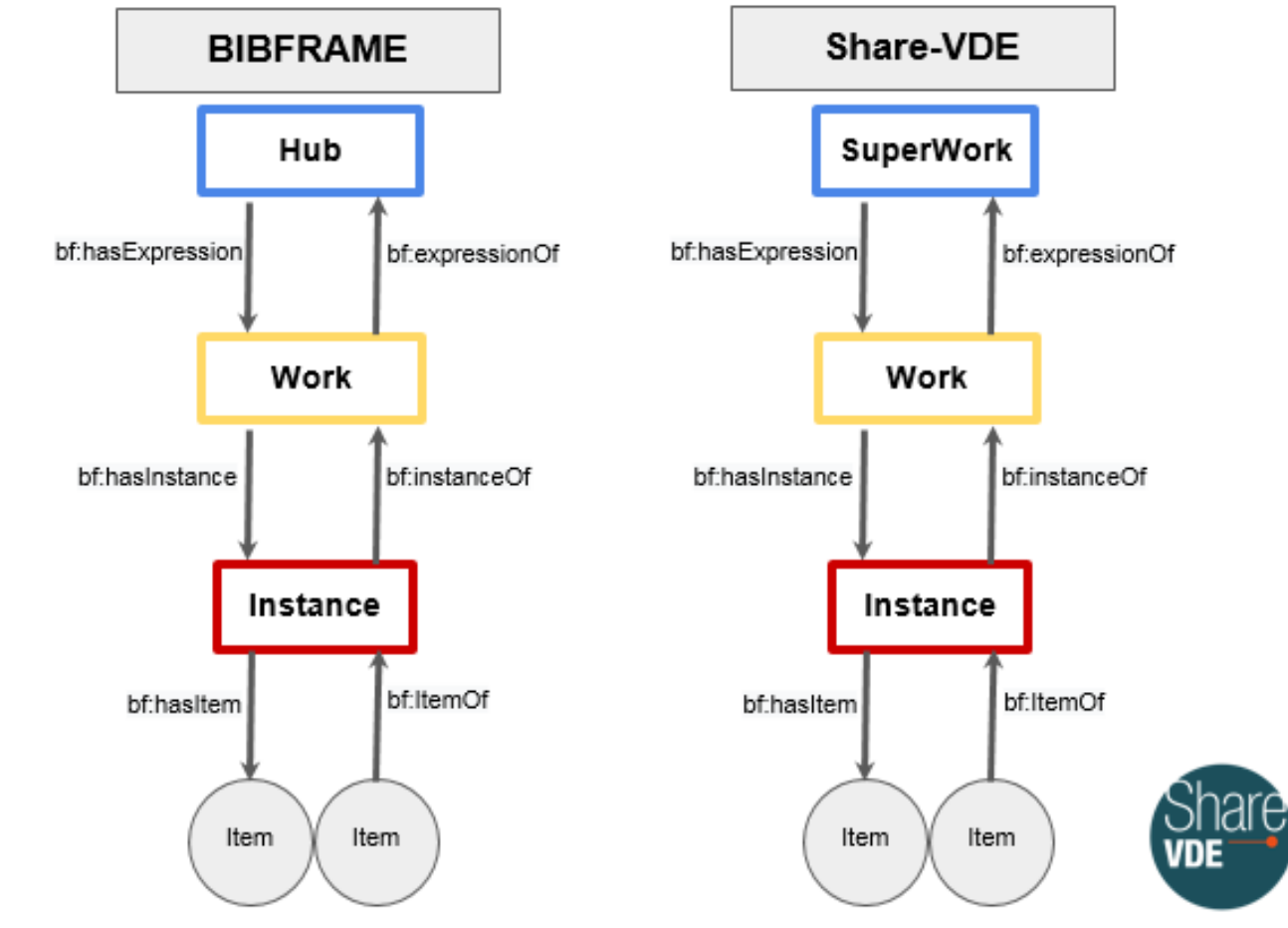

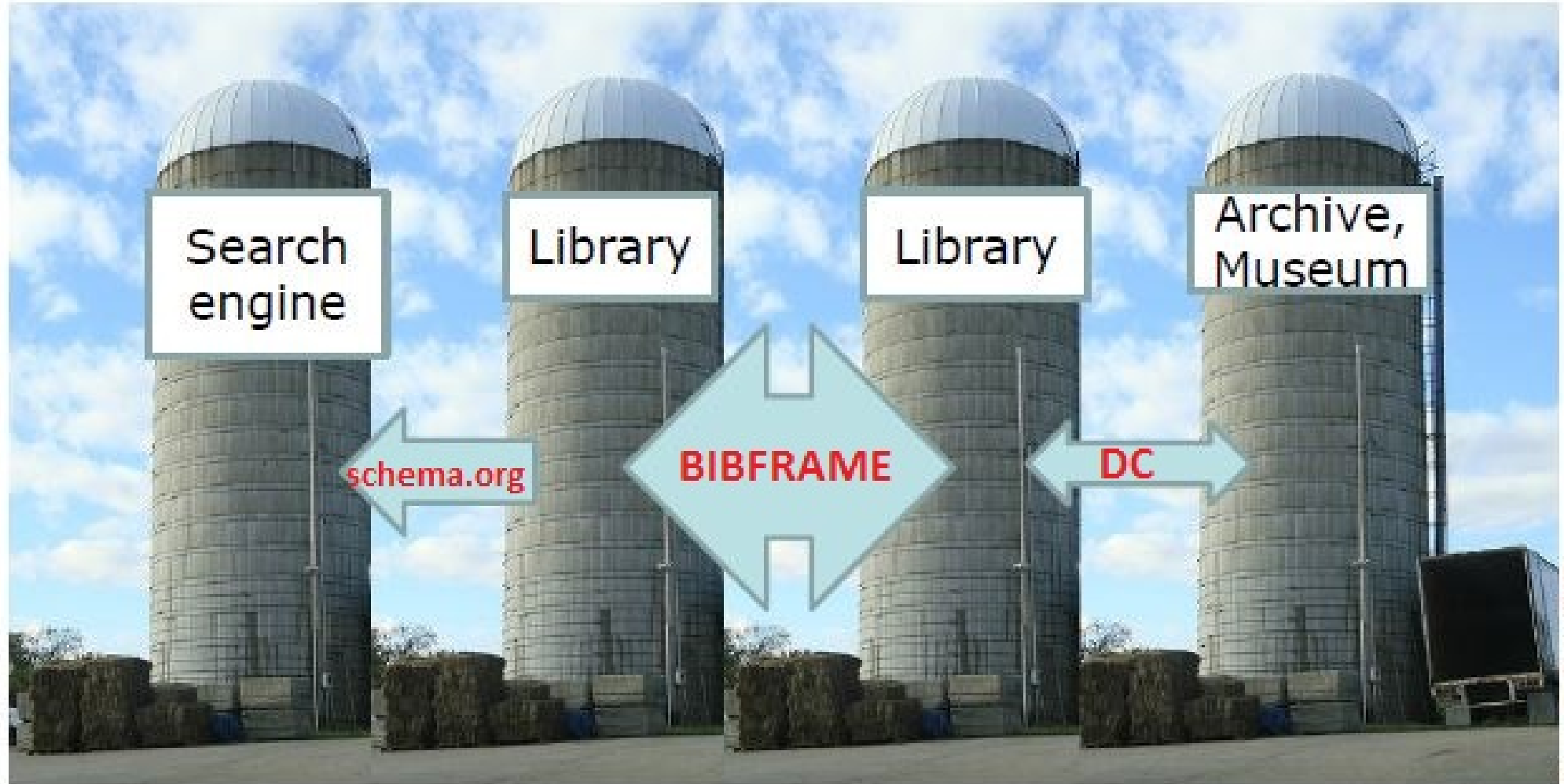

Flexible definable workflows

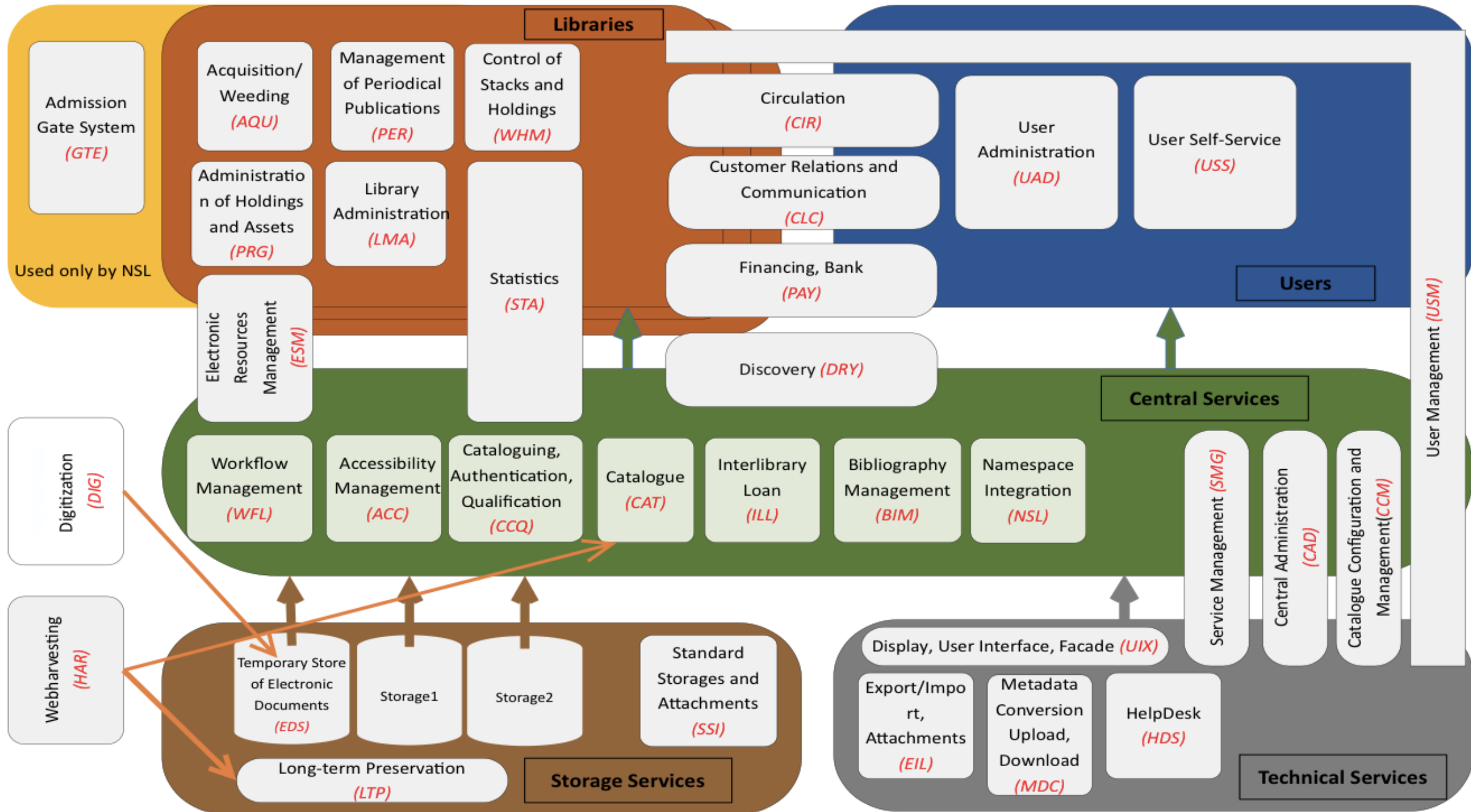
Modules are exchangeable, can be used in parallel – the preferred solution is microservices.

Entity based data models

FRBR as data model, RDA as cataloguing standard, BIBFRAME2 as data exchange format.

Real multi-tenancy

Private and shared data between participants.
